The plan is to interview people and create artworks, based on info I get. About meaning of happiness, about fears. It all will be filmed, shot, performed in my surrealistic/magic realism style and then shown in a so called "Box or reminder".

I know, that it is hard to know everything that makes every human being happy on this planet, but I think I can find right method to make users of box to feel, what I wanna say.

Biography:

Maria Kazvan was born in 1989. Based in Lviv, Ukraine. Started practicing photography 15+ years ago as a portrait photographer, slightly turned her practice into a conceptual, fine art photography, then to videography, stop-motion, performances.

Maria mostly speaks about her own experiences, but sometimes she works with other people too. Her project "16 women", dedicated to #16daysofactivism - a yearly actions that speaks about gender-based violence. Project is based on the stories of women, that survived violence. She interviewed women for three months and then created art out of their stories.
